WHAT'S HAPPENED?

Bramley Parish Council update

At the Parish Council meeting in January, a number of matters were discussed, including:

- Waverley Borough Councilor Lauren Atkins reported that collaboration between Waverley Borough Council and Guildford Borough Council continues at the November WBC Executive agreed to pursue further collaboration. Councillor Atkins and Councillor Austin attended the meeting and scrutinised, having strong concerns about lack of clarity and visibility of financial and other benefits of the collaboration. A new Joint CEO is now appointed at a cost of C.£165k and money is being expended aligning the Constitutions of the respective Councils. As these progresses there are further major potential costs ahead, coupled with concerns about collaborating with a Council in ongoing danger of going into administration and under investigation for fraud.
- Surrey County Councilor Kevin Deanus advised that installation of the average speed cameras has been
 delayed due to proximity of utility service pipes to one location. This is causing a challenge to the
 installation as it risks disruption to electrical and gas services to the village. While there is
 consideration for relocating the pipe, it may involve the installation of a larger pole to accommodate
 the necessary adjustments. It is a problem, and the installers are working on the best solution. It is
 important to make the village aware of these issues, particularly in the context of when the average
 speed cameras are scheduled to be erected.

- Crime It is shocking and saddening to learn of the death of several Lambs at Gate Street Barn. This comes on top of numerous other incidents of crime/trespass/vandalism in recent months.
- Highways Committee Councillor K Deanus suggests using the following link for the SCC Highway website: https://uk.one.network/communicate/onenetwork-map. This link provides access to the one.network Map, serving as a platform for highway authorities to effectively communicate accurate and current information about roadworks, events, and other activities on the highway. As the national stakeholder engagement channel, utility companies, contractors, bus operators, and emergency services rely on it for information about ongoing works. Users can register for email alerts, receiving valuable notifications about upcoming roadworks that may impact their area. This feature particularly benefits local councillors and individuals with public information responsibilities.
- Neighbourhood Plan: WBC has called for sites for their new Local Plan. BPC will not get sight of the list
 of sites before the deadline of March.

Bramley Fuel Leak Update

Community Information Meeting

For Bramley residents— ASDA and EPS Environmental Consultants have agreed to join us for a public meeting when they will provide a progress update and answer any queries you might have. Jeremy Hunt will chair with Waverley Borough Councillors Jane Austin and Michael Goodridge MBE.

It will be held on 13th February 6pm-7pm— please email huntj@parliament.uk to reserve a place as we expect the event will be busy.

On Friday 12th Jeremy Hunt MP, Councillor Jane Austin and Councillor Michael Goodridge met with James Barge of Asda plus representatives from EPS, Asda's Environmental Consultants for a progress update. Asda inherited this fuel pollution from the Co-op that owned the site before. They confirmed that the leak is now sealed (although they are double checking).

The land underneath the petrol station is sand which is holding a mixture of water and petrol a bit like a sponge. So pumps are being inserted into the sand via boreholes. The boreholes are now built, and the pumping will start as soon as permissions come through, expected to be in early March. The hope is that as soon as they start we will start to see a dramatic reduction in the smell and pollution into the stream although the whole process will take several months.

Work to install a barrier pipe to two properties on the High Street whose supply was contaminated by fuel continues. Teams have been working round the clock since Monday 8th January; it is a major job requiring lots of heavy machinery and two-way traffic lights. This has been very disruptive to local neighbours and for traffic causing major queues. This work was scheduled to be completed by 19th January, the traffic lights were removed on January 18th and this is a major step to allow the next clean up phase of work and the removal of one of the main sources of the fuel smell.
