 It has been a relatively quiet month - on 29th August an Extraordinary General Meeting was held in order to approve a new Interim Section 151 Officer to serve both Waverley and Guildford Borough Councils and to request approval of £1.96m additional spend on the retail element of 69 High Street, Godalming.

News from Bramley History Society

Bramley has an interesting history and Bramley History Society was established in 1994 to research our past. Our findings have informed various displays over the years and our publication 'The Bramley Record' has had articles on individuals, such as Gertrude Jekyll (who lived in Bramley Park for 20 years from 1848 and has left us her memories of the village in her childhood) and Charlotte Sutherland (who also came here in 1848 and lived in Church House but died 4 years later having funded the building of the North aisle of the church, the village school and the now demolished Vicarage and Cemetery Chapel).

For the millennium we had a project, SNAP 2000, and now have a photographic record of all the buildings in

the parish.

However if we do not get some new volunteers to join the committee we will have no option but to go into 'hibernation' after our AGM in the autumn. It does not require a great deal of time and the 4 public meetings a year which we have had could be dispensed with - though this would be a pity as we have had some very interesting talks over the years.

Household Support Fund - Help for households worried about the cost of living

The Government announced the Household Support Fund to support vulnerable households back in 2019. The Government announced it will continue to support households most in need, to help with global inflationary challenges, by providing an additional £842m for the Household Support Fund across England during 2023/24. It is designed to help ease financial pressures on residents by providing short-term help. The Waverley fund will remain open until March 31st 2024, or until the funds run out.

The current tranche of the Household Support Fund is available to support those most in need, to help with the rising cost of living. Households in Waverley are encouraged to apply for help with essential household items.

Grants of up to £550 are available towards:

- Food
- Utilities gas, electricity and water
- Essentials linked to energy and water such as warm clothing, boiler repair, heaters, draught excluders
- Essential household appliances such as a cooker, washing machine, microwave, slow cooker, air fryer
- Essential household items such as school uniform, bedding.

Information about how households can apply is available on our website <u>Waverley Borough Council - Financial</u> <u>support for residents</u>

This fund is available until 31 March 2024 or until all funds are spent, whichever is sooner.

News from The Wey and Arun Canal Trust - Closing of the Birtley Walk.

The Wey and Arun are pleased to tell you that we are nearing the end of our work on the Birtley section. However in order to complete the works I am afraid we will need to close the Permissive path from September 4th to 8th and September 18th to the 28th. If our contractors finish before the date, we will reopen earlier.

Surrey Connect On-demand bus service launches in Farnham and Cranleigh from 4th September

This is a new shared bus service, funded by Surrey County Council, is available in areas of the county where there are fewer commercial services, to help make travelling sustainably easier. Rather than being restricted by traditional bus timetables, the accessible minibuses are available for everyone when they need them. Fares are charged based on how many miles are travelled, starting from £2 for adults.
